<p>Communicator- (Confidence, Creativity)</p> 	<p>Ask your child to call, email or write a letter to a relative. Explain the importance of communicating with others.</p> <p>While completing homework, ask your child questions such as: How did you come up with that answer? <p>Principled- (Integrity, Respect)</p> 	<p>Play a game with your child. Discuss the rules and the importance of following the rules. Help your child learn to be a good winner and a good loser. When your child wins, shake his/her hand and tell him/her congratulations. When your child loses, teach him/her to lose well and tell the winner congratulations.</p>	<p>Nov. 29 – Dec. 10</p>
