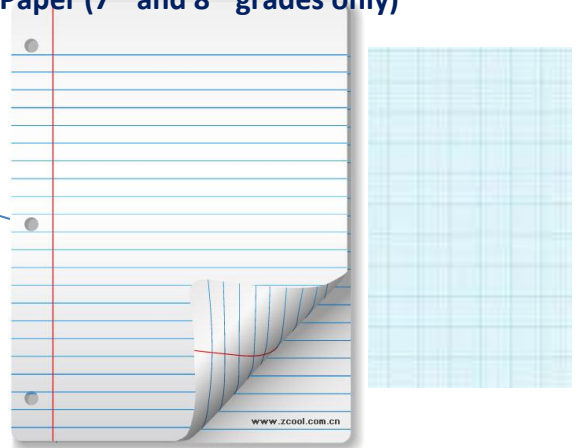


Front Flap—"To Do" only

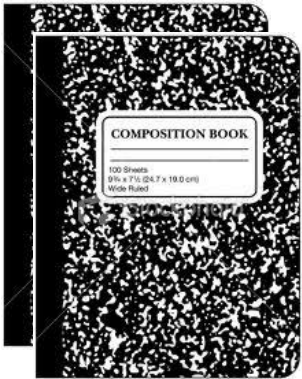
Back Flap—College-ruled Notebook Paper / Graph Paper (7th and 8th grades only)



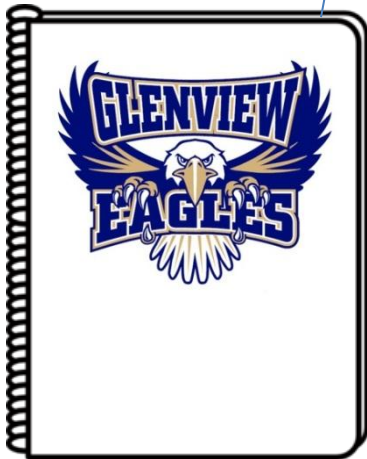

Glenview 3" Binder Set-up:

A School-Wide AVID Strategy

1. **Inside front flap of the 3" binder** is only for items that need to be dealt with immediately, ex. homework to complete, forms to be signed, etc. Any school-to-home communication should go in this flap. It is extremely important that the papers in this flap are cleaned out nightly; once homework is complete, it needs to be filed in the appropriate class folder.
2. Pencil pouch with supplies: **Do not overstuff the pencil pouch.** Place extra supplies in a zippered bag and store in the backpack.
 - 2 - **pencils** (lots of lead if mechanical; white erasers best for scantrons)
 - 2 - **pens** (black or blue; red for corrections)
 - 1 - **glue sticks**
 - 1 - **highlighters**
 - 1 - **dry erase markers**
 - 1 - pack of **sticky notes** (preferred 1 ½ X 2 inch)
 - 1 - pack of **colored pencils**
 - 1 - set of **earbuds**
 - 1 - **3 ½ X 5 inch lined index cards**

***This pouch needs to be checked daily and supplies replenished when needed.

3. **Agenda** (provided by school), this needs to be referred to nightly. Students may ask teacher to sign that assignments are recorded correctly each day so that parents are well-informed. This is a great place for parents and teachers to jot notes to each other.
4. Pocket folders are inserted according to class schedule. These folders should be labeled with the name of the class. Purchase **10 pocket folders.**
5. Spiral composition books are placed **behind** each pocket folder. These notebooks should be labeled with student name, class, and nine weeks grading period. **Do not rip pages out of the composition notebooks.** Purchase **25 spiral composition books.** **8th graders need 2 bound composition books** (no spiral or perforated pages).
6. The **back inside flap** is used only for storing **college-ruled notebook paper.** **Do not insert blank paper behind the pocket folders.** (It won't fit)! This paper is to be used when teachers do not wish for the spiral notebooks to be turned in, not for note taking or homework assignments. Some students prefer to keep blank paper in a small binder or folder; this is acceptable as long as it contains **only blank paper and nothing else.** **Do not overstuff the back flap with blank paper,** 50 sheets is plenty. Replenish this paper as needed. **7th and 8th graders need graph paper.**

**** All work is to be placed in this one binder and it is to be used for all classes, eliminating the "I left it in my other notebook in my locker". It is also to be carried home each day, thus eliminating the "I left it at school" excuses.

****Backpacks should be checked on a regular basis to ensure that papers are being filed in the binder. No loose papers should float around in the backpack nor should they be stuck inside textbooks.
