Dear Parents,

Middle school students who take high school credit classes must have an average of 70/C or higher at the end of the first semester to remain in the classes for the duration of the year. Due to risks associated with state level testing, future high school placement, and academic awards/scholarship eligibility, students with less than a 70/C at the end of the first semester **will** be moved to another class in that subject area. Please understand that we have your child's best interest at heart and there is ample time to take credit-bearing courses in high school.

Please be advised that at the end of the first nine weeks, if your child has a grade below a 70/C, it is recommended that he/she transfer out of the high school credit-bearing class. However, if you decide to keep your child in the class, he/she must exhibit the characteristics necessary to be successful and improve his/her grade to a 70/C or higher by the end of the first semester.

If your child remains in an honors level credit-bearing course for the year, please be advised that he/she must earn an average of 80/B or higher to be placed in an honors course at the high school level.

Middle school students who take GT classes must maintain certain grades in order to remain in the course. Please be advised that at the end of the first nine weeks, if your child has a grade below a 70/C, it is recommended that he/she transfer out of the GT class. However, if you decide to keep your child in the class, he/she must exhibit the characteristics necessary to be successful and improve his/her grade to a 70/C or higher by the end of the first semester.

Students must have an average of 70/C or higher at the end of the first semester to remain in the class for the duration of the year. Students with less than a 70/C at the end of the first semester will be placed in an accelerated class (ELA or Math) or a grade level class (Science). Please understand that we have your child's best interest at heart and want them to be successful.

If your child remains in a GT class for the year, please be advised that he/she must earn an average of 80/B or higher to be placed in the next level GT class in that subject area the next school year.

GT students must make an 80/B or higher in their respective course to qualify for placement in the same level class in that subject area in next grade. GT students are on track to take high school credit-bearing ELA and Math classes if they meet certain criteria.

If your child remains in an accelerated class for the year, please be advised that he/she must earn an average of 80/B or higher to be placed in the next level accelerated or honor's level class in that subject area the next school year.

Accelerated students must make an 80/B or higher in their respective course to qualify for placement in the same level class in that subject area in next grade. Accelerated students are on track to take high school credit-bearing ELA and Math classes if they meet certain criteria.
