Publisher, Publication Date. *Name of the Database (italicized)*. Web (medium

of publication). Date of access in day, month, year format.

Title of the Anthology/Collection (in italics). Editor(s). Edition (if later than the first).

City of Publication: Publisher, Publication Date: Page number(s) of cited piece.

Name of the Database (italicized). Web (medium of publication). Date of access.

Articles from Encyclopedias and Other Electronic Reference Sources on the Web Available through the Pensacola State College Library Databases:

These articles were originally published in a print publication and then reproduced in a library subscription database. Document the information for the original print publication and then add the word "Web" and the date of access in day, month, year format. Abbreviate all months except for May, June and July.
